A goal of the community foundation is to serve those who want to explore the power of giving and can understand how endowments, long term investments, can help build and sustain vibrant communities. Endowments renew through prudent investing and new gifts while always preserving the principal. Endowments embody the desire of community members now to guarantee future generations the same quality of life or better. This is the product and the mechanics of what the community foundation uses to accomplish its goals.

But, the community foundation's main goal here in our community is to help carry out the charitable wishes, legacies and goals of our giving citizens.

In this report, you will find list after list recognizing our generous and community minded donors to our 190 funds that last year alone awarded \$867,860 in grants and scholarships to 245 organizations and college bound students.

Certainly, all the funds you read about have been established to do good. The funds support scholarships, churches, food pantries, youth and senior services, preservation, the arts and the overall health and wellbeing of our people and places.

But, these funds too have been established to keep the memory of loved ones alive forever, to honor others, to give back, to pass on family values, to directly support an organization's future, to get a tax break, and in some cases just because the donor understands how meaningful and fun it is to give and have a say in where charitable dollars go.

We have even had some funds established because entire communities have come together to accomplish a common community goal. The Arms of Life Fund is a perfect example of how a community can come together and partner with the community foundation. Through this process, members of the Center Grove area were successful in purchasing railroad safety equipment to make it safer for all of us and even our children to live, work and attend school in Center Grove.

lights and cross arms at three Johnson County railroad crossings. Concerned citizens launched a fundraising effort called the Arms of Life Fund, said Heidi Sichting, executive director for Center Grove schools corporation's education foundation.

JCCF board and staff understand that "taking care of our own" is an endearing characteristic of our county. We know philanthropists quickly seek ways to reach out to neighbors in need.

As a public charity with 501(c)3 status, the foundation offers funding development for local nonprofit programs. Donors who wish to support specific funds or develop funds of their own may commit to this lasting community work through involvement with JCCF.

Numerous examples of how the foundation works in the community keep this well-respected organization growing stronger.

In February, 2007, two young brothers, Jake and Travis Findley, were killed in a train accident at a Johnson County railroad crossing. Grieving community members took action to add flashing



JCCF staff provided information about the legalities of fundraising and offered safe, convenient avenues for donors to contribute. "We were able to expand the role we both played," Sichting said of her responsibility, raising money through the school corporation and the role of JCCF, as a designation for corporate and community donors. "To maximize the opportunity for individuals and corporations to give, it was tremendously important for us to have that partnership and camaraderie with the foundation," Sichting said.

Working with all involved agencies, \$625,000

was raised toward this effort, Sichting said.

Likewise, Suzanne Findley, former superintendent of Parks in Franklin and Don Cummings, an avid bicyclist in Greenwood, turned to the foundation with community trail development on

their minds. "There are a lot of people who use the trails a lot and love them. And want to see them go on," Findley said.

Like most great ideas, however, money was the issue, Findley said. Hundreds of thousands of dollars were needed, not only to make a trail system a reality but to also maintain it. Knowing that many residents are leery of donating money to large agencies, Findley contacted the foundation. The foundation's close community

contact would only enhance fundraising efforts, she said. "People involved with the foundation are people who really care about the community," Findley said.

Volunteers for the development of the Greater Greenwood Trails fund quickly

discovered that to raise necessary funds, 501(c)3 status was necessary, Cummings said. "We partnered with the foundation for trail donations," Cummings said.

To date, the Franklin trail system is enjoyed by hundreds of residents. According to Cummings, JCCF has been instrumental in helping the Greater Greenwood Trails fundraise \$14,000.

But the Johnson County Community Foundation isn't only an avenue for projects raising hundreds of thousands of dollars. Sometimes a few thousand dollars makes all the difference, said Nancy Voris of Nineveh.

When she and other Nineveh residents explored various ways to bring people together in their small burg south of Franklin, they too turned to JCCF. With a grant provided two years ago by the foun-

dation, the town of Nineveh planned various community events. Accessing the grant of \$5,000 served as seed money and paved the way for more fundraising efforts and community events, Voris said.

"The enthusiasm and leadership of the committee mem-

bers is really driving the endowment fund," Voris said. "We've had a great time working together and building community spirit."

At the Johnson County railroad crossing where Jake and Travis Findley, were killed in a train accident, a sign was placed in memory of the Findleys and directs readers to the Arms of Life fund at JCCF. Stuffed animals, wearing Arms of Life t-shirts, like the one on the signpost, were sold to raise money for the fund.



Sandy Daniels retires after 16 years of service to JCCF

Coming

It was an honor and labor of love to be the first full time director of JCCF, a position I assumed in 1994. What a fun challenge it was to cus-

tomize and grow a community foundation to meet the needs of our own community!

JCCF is a strong organization, poised to serve our community forever. When I look back to those early years, I am awed by the sheer scope of the task, our own tenacious commitment to stay the course and the permanent footprints we have left behind.

We made a commitment to excellence. even when we were housed in a one room office with a donated typewriter. We also made a commitment to be agile, accessible and humble. This meant making our grant seeking processes as simplified as possible, but never compromising the due diligence of accountability in the use of our funds.

I am most proud of the fact that JCCF was one of the first in the country to achieve national and state compliance with ethical and operating standards for community foundations. JCCF also won numerous national awards for effective communications related to our open transparency in our annual reports, newsletters and grants program.

I am also proud that we have had a sustained and ever growing commitment to support our nonprofit community through the provision of direct and educational technical assistance. We made it our duty to keep abreast of changing laws and regulations impacting the nonprofit field, as well

> as cutting edge processes for effective and efficient management and governance.

We housed a nonprofit resource library, providing materials to area nonprofits to use (holding down their own internal costs). We partnered with Franklin College in the provision of an ongoing series of nonprofit classes. And, we committed a large share of our grants to build the capacity of nonprofits to better serve their missions.

We treated each grant as an investment

in the community. While we issued small

grants that met a huge need in fledgling

grassroots organizations, we also tackled

major projects that required leadership to

build public and private partnerships.

and accountability of the funds. This encouraged a broader base of donors to financially support the

projects. It was a proud moment when I heard many years ago that a county leader said that JCCF's involvement is like the Good Housekeeping Seal of Approval. "If they are involved, they have done the homework to establish validity and will not waver for its completion."

As you can see, I haven't summarized our accomplishment only in numbers, although that is an important metric for impact. Rather, I appeal that our success has been grounded in basic tenets of inclusion, excellence and the power of ordinary people to accomplish extraordinary things. But, our job is not finished. Never before has the need for private philanthropy and leadership been greater. New challenges lie ahead to keep the foundation relevant and impactful.

Yes, the foundation has come full circle. A circle is an architectural concept that denotes completeness – no start or end, but rather a perpetual and ever-widening linkage. In those early years, I merely sketched out lines of ideas and actions. With the help of dedicated board members and donors, we created the intersecting linkages that brought it all together. The "circle" of JCCF is indeed strong. Our new leadership only needs to work to keep tracing the circle to strengthen and enlarge it to be even more inclusive and encompassing. It can and must be the voice and vision for our community. JCCF is built to inspire philanthropy, to act boldly, and to bring everyone into the circle of engagement.

Thank you for giving me the opportunity to serve the community for 16 years. You welcomed me into your hearts and homes and

We encourage contact between grant seekers and foundation staff before, during and after the proposal review process. We provide applicants with general advice about our process and funding priorities. Grant seekers must use our grant application. There are established annual grant cycles. However, we are responsive to emergency needs or time sensitive opportunities, so contact us at any time.

To be eligible, an organization must qualify under the regulations of the U.S. Treasury codes as a nonprofit. The community foundation works to further charitable projects in compliance with these regulations, as well as in compliance with nondiscrimination practices.

Nonprofits may make a letter of inquiry that contains a brief statement of needs and enough information about the project for us to determine if a formal application is necessary. If so, we will provide you with an application and comprehensive guidelines. You may also obtain additional information regarding our grant guidelines by visiting our website at www.jccf.org.



The Johnson County Community Foundation follows a diversified multi asset, multi management style as it relates to the in-

vestment of its portfolio. Investments are diversified with approximately 40% in Fixed Income Bonds and Mutual Funds and 60% in Common Stocks and Common Stock Mutual Funds. In addition the Common Stock portion of the investment portfolio is further diversified into multiple Large Cap, Mid Cap, Small Cap, International and Emerging Market Funds.

Every quarter we measure the performance of each investment group to industry bench marks such as the S&P 500, Lehman Brothers Aggregate Bond Index, Russell Mid-Cap Index, Russell 2000 Index and the MSCI FAFF Index

For the calendar year ending December 31, 2007 the aggregate investment performance of the JCCF investment portfolio was up 6.3%. This compared favorable to a Balance Industry Index of 5.8%.

For the last three years our portfolio has increased at a rate of 8.7%

and for the last five years 12.2% respectively. This compares to a Balance Market Index comprised of 70% Russell 3000 Index and 30% Lehman brothers Aggregate Bond Index, of 7.7% and 10.9%.

Much volatility marked the year in 2007. Fear of an economic slowdown, a declining dollar and higher energy costs all contributed to investors choosing higher quality larger companies rather than mid sized and or smaller stocks. International investments and emerging markets significantly outperformed domestic investments and bonds turned in one of its best performances in many years due to the decline in short term interest rates.

In 2008 we continue to be committed to our investment philosophy of prudent investment management and proper consistent evaluation and monitoring.

Partnering with Franklin College

Since 2000 JCCF has partnered closely with Franklin College to provide two successful programs to the county and beyond.

JCCF first partnered with Franklin College through its Center for Community Partnerships for an on-

going nonprofit management continuing education program. One function of JCCF is to assist nonprofits with building capacity for them to effectively carry out the work they do. Beyond giving grants, the educational management program is one way for JCCF to meet the need. The program offers a Nonprofit Management Certificate through the college and continues to educate nonprofit leaders – staff, board members and volunteers – in the best

practices of nonprofit management.

Then through a grant from Lilly Endowment Inc. to both the college and JCCF, the Community Alliance to Promote Education (CAPE) was brought to Johnson County. CAPE funds allowed us to offer assistance in early childhood readiness efforts. CAPE launched the countywide pre kindergarten camps in 2006 and the Parent-Child Home Program in 2007.





The kindergarten camps give those about to go to kindergarten a needed boost in getting ready for the year ahead. The Parent-Child Home Program (PCHP) provides 23 week, in-home visits to families with young children to introduce books, toys and ideas that encourage a positive, language rich environment. This was the first year for the program in Johnson County, but PCHP has been around for

more than 35 years with proven academic success.

The annual meeting invitation encouraged the community to open doors.

JCCF welcomed Elaine Haehl as its interim president and CEO while the search committee conducted a thorough national search for its top staff position.
