

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

2005 In Review

It is our pleasure to share with you this copy of the Community Foundation for Northeast Michigan's 2005 Annual Report. We had a very busy, productive year, as our family of donors grew, our collection of funds expanded, and Foundation grants continued to financially support a wide variety of charitable programs and activities in northeast Michigan.

Community foundations are somewhat unique among charitable organizations, in that they exist to support the endeavors of a wide variety of organizations and causes. We also exist to help donors realize their dreams of helping others through their financial gifts. We do both of these functions in such a way that the gifts will be here, as an endowment, for generations to come. We, at the Community Foundation, are especially blessed to be able to work with people and organizations exhibiting such great love for northeast Michigan.

During 2005 we received two of the largest individual gifts in our history. A \$3 million gift from an anonymous donor made it possible for your Community Foundation to purchase the Thunder Bay Recreation Center. In addition, it allows the Community Foundation to ensure that this beautiful facility remains a community building and continues to benefit the residents of northeast Michigan for years to come. We also received a bequest of nearly \$1.5 million from Dee Brown Perry to establish the Dee Brown Perry Scholarship Fund. This new scholarship endowment will benefit students graduating from Alcona High School for generations. These gifts are important to the Community Foundation, but we also believe in the power of all gifts, big or small. While these large gifts give us a boost in our ability to help the residents of northeast Michigan, it is the thousands of gifts from individuals like you and me that have built the Community Foundation since it was established in 1974.

In 2005, your Community Foundation grew by thirty-two percent. We received gifts of approximately \$5 million and paid out grants totaling nearly \$1 million. This growth further strengthens the Community Foundation's ability to serve the residents of northeast Michigan and make the region a better place to live and raise our families.

During 2005, your Community Foundation submitted documentation to the Council on Foundations (CoF) in Washington D.C. to meet the rigorous new national standards for U.S. community foundations. This is currently a voluntary program with CoF, but your Community Foundation Board of Trustees believed that meeting these new standards would make us better stewards for the communities we serve. After months of hard work by the staff and board committees, the paperwork was submitted, and we were notified in September 2005 that we had passed with flying colors! As a result of this, you will notice in the future a little CF logo on our letters and publications, which also states that we have met the national standards for U.S. Community Foundations, as set by the Council on Foundations.

As you review our 2005 Annual Report, we encourage you to consider the donors behind the programs, grants, and funds that make our work possible. We thank those who are making a positive difference in northeast Michigan, and we invite you to join our cause. Together we are improving the quality of life in the communities of northeast Michigan.

Youth Advisory Councils

The Community Foundation for Northeast Michigan (CFNEM) and each of its three affiliates has a Youth Advisory Council (YAC). This youth committee enables young people to help solve problems affecting their communities and peers through a grant application and review process. Each YAC represents a group of area youth, generally age 12 to 21, whose members recommend grant awards for youth related projects and programs. Adult advisors work with YAC members to provide guidance and organization during the grant review process and these recommendations are then presented to the Board of Trustees for final approval.

In 1992, the CFNEM Board of Trustees created a YAC in response to a statewide challenge issued by the W.K. Kellogg Foundation. To meet the requirements of the challenge, CFNEM had to raise \$2 million in unrestricted or broad field-of-interest funds to receive a match from Kellogg of \$1 million to be used to establish a youth endowment fund. The Northeast Michigan Youth Advisory Council (NEMYAC) was then created with youth from the counties of Alcona, Alpena, Montmorency, and Presque Isle.

In 1998, the W.K. Kellogg Foundation offered another matching opportunity for areas not yet being served by a community foundation. CFNEM took that opportunity to raise money to create three affiliate foundations—each with its own YAC. There are now YACs serving in Crawford, Ogemaw, and Oscoda Counties under the North Central Michigan Community Foundation (NCMCF); Cheboygan County and Mackinaw City under the Straits Area Community Foundation (SACF); and Iosco County under the Iosco County Community Foundation (ICCF).

The CFNEM Kellogg Youth Fund had assets on September 30, 2005, of \$1,271,554. Since it was created in 1992, the NEMYAC fund has provided over \$694,500 in grants for youth projects and programs.

NCMCF has a separate YAC and fund for each of its three counties. On September 30, 2005, the Crawford County Kellogg Youth Fund had assets of \$52,597; the Ogemaw County Kellogg Youth Fund had assets of \$274,027; and the Oscoda County Kellogg Youth Fund had assets of \$55,508. Since they were created in 1998, the NCMCF YACs have provided over \$86,600 in grants for youth projects and programs.

The SACF Kellogg Youth Fund had assets on September 30, 2005, of \$100,839. Since it was created in 1998, this fund has provided over \$25,500 in grants for youth projects and programs.

The ICCF Kellogg Youth Fund had assets on September 30, 2005, of \$277,669. Since it was created in 1998, this fund has provided over \$60,800 in grants for youth projects and programs.

The following are just a few examples of grants awarded for youth projects by these YACs in 2005:

- \$2,000 for the new playground at Ella White Elementary School in Alpena
- \$2,500 for a Peer Support Program at Rogers City Area Schools
- \$1,347 to the Alcona MSU Extension/Alcona County 4-H for the 4-H Detroit Daytrip
- \$2,500 for the Teen Haven project at the West Branch District Library
- \$1,075 for the Nor'east'r Music and Art Festival
- \$300 to the C.O.O.R. Intermediate School District for a Health Occupations Students of America Competition
- \$300 to Wolverine High School for a digital camera for the yearbook staff
- \$2,500 to the Huron Hockey and Skating Association in Tawas, Michigan for a new sound system
- \$2,000 to the Oscoda Community Skatepark in Oscoda, Michigan, for surfacing skatepark ramps.



2005 FUNDS

Charitable Giving Through the Community Foundation

The Community Foundation for Northeast Michigan is a vehicle for donors from all walks of life to give something back to their community. Giving through the Community Foundation is not complicated, nor does it require great wealth. Community Foundation donors all share a dream of enriching the lives of others, while creating a legacy of giving that goes on forever.

We help individuals, businesses and organizations achieve their charitable goals through the establishment of permanent endowment funds, the income from which is used to award grants to charitable causes in the communities we serve. We also administer donor-advised funds of both a permanent and nonpermanent nature. All gifts are professionally managed and pooled for diversified investment and economies of scale and to increase their charitable impact. Investment performance is reviewed quarterly and monitored by the Community Foundation's Investment Committee.

You have several options when making a gift to the Community Foundation. You may, of course, contribute to an existing fund. Or, you can establish your own Foundation fund, either during your lifetime or through your estate plan, with a gift of as little as \$5,000. Funds can be established in your name, or in the name of your family, your organization, or someone you wish to honor. All grants distributed from your fund -- today and in the future -- are awarded to local charities in the name of your fund.

Types of Funds

UNRESTRICTED FUND

Your gift may be used to meet ever-changing community needs, including future needs, which often cannot be anticipated at the time your gift is made. The Community Foundation staff and Board annually evaluate all aspects of community well being -- arts and culture, health and human services, youth programs, economic development, education, environment, neighborhood revitalization, and more. Grants from your fund are then used to make a difference in the areas where they are needed most.

FIELD-OF-INTEREST FUND

You may target your gift to address needs in an important area of community life, such as the performing arts, youth, seniors, feeding the hungry, providing scholarships, or assisting the disabled. You identify your personal interest area when making your gift, and our Board awards grants to community agencies and programs that are making a difference in the area you select.

DONOR-ADVISED FUND

Ongoing involvement in the use of your gift is also an option. You can work with our professional grantmaking staff, identifying ways to use dollars from your donoradvised fund to address the community needs you care about most. Your grant recommendations are submitted to our Board of Trustees for approval; we then administer the approved grants from your fund.

DESIGNATED FUND

Your gift may be directed to a specific agency or purpose. For example, you can provide ongoing funding for the American Red Cross, your local homeless shelter, Boys and Girls Club, or your church. You identify the recipients you wish to benefit through your gift; our staff manages the annual distribution of funds.

AGENCY ENDOWMENT FUND

An agency fund is a partnership between your nonprofit organization and the Community Foundation. We provide professional investment management and administration for the fund, and each year the income from the fund provides a stable source of funding for your organization's charitable work.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND

Scholarship funds provide scholarships and educational grants based on specific guidelines and selection criteria that you establish when you make your gift.

ADMINISTRATIVE FUND

These funds support the ongoing operations of Community Foundation for Northeast Michigan and each of its three affiliates; North Central Michigan Community Foundation; Straits Area Community Foundation; Iosco County Community Foundation.

What to Give

Your gift to the Community Foundation may be made in many forms, including:

- Cash, stocks, bonds, real estate, and/or personal property
- Gifts memorializing or honoring loved ones
- **Bequests**
- Life insurance naming the Community Foundation as beneficiary and/or owner
- Individual retirement accounts and charitable lead or remainder trusts
- Conversion of a private foundation to a Community Foundation fund

Funds Currently Held by the Foundation

You may contribute to the Community Foundation without establishing your own fund. Anyone may contribute to the following established funds at any time, in any amount. As you can see, each fund's purpose varies with the charitable intent of the original donor, providing donors with a wide variety of philanthropic choices. The following lists describe the funds established with the Community Foundation. Fund names in color represent new funds this year.

COMMUNITY FOUNDATION FOR NORTHEAST MICHIGAN (CFNEM) FUNDS

(Serving the counties of Alcona, Alpena, Montmorency and Presque Isle)

AGENCY FUNDS - The following funds have been established with the Community Foundation by nonprofit organizations to help in supporting their ongoing needs.

*Alcona Conservation District **Endowment Fund**

This endowment fund was established to assist with the operating expenses of the Alcona Soil Conservation District office.

Alpena Alzheimer's Association Fund

This non-endowed fund was established to assist with the operating expenses of the Alpena Alzheimer's Association, and/or for its charitable interests.

Alpena Area Recreation Commission **Operating Fund**

This non-endowed fund was established to assist with the operating expenses of the Alpena Recreation Commission.

**Alpena County Library Fund

This non-endowed fund was created to meet the general needs of the Alpena County Library, including but not limited to, long-term needs for capital improvement.

*Stanley Beck Junior Achievement of Alpena Fund

This endowment fund was designed to assist Junior Achievement of Alpena with its needs.

Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Alpena Fund This non-endowed fund is designated for the operating needs of Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Northeast Michigan.

Boys and Girls Club of Alpena

Operating Fund

This non-endowed fund is designated for the operating needs of the Boys and Girls Club of Alpena.

*Curtis Township Library Endowment Fund

This endowment fund will help support the Curtis Township Library in Glennie, Michigan.

Faith and Hope Hospitality House Fund This non-endowed fund was started to establish and operate a hospitality house in Alpena for patients of Alpena

Regional Medical Center.

First Congregational Church

Parsonage Fund

This non-endowed fund was established to help meet the housing needs for the pastor of the First Congregational Church of Alpena.

*Grace Lutheran Church

Endowment Fund

This endowment fund was established to assist with the needs of Grace Lutheran Church in Alpena.

Henry and Peggy Hoffman Presque Isle District Library Fund

This non-endowed fund was created by a bequest for the benefit of the Presque Isle District Library.

Henry and Peggy Hoffman Presque Isle Museum Fund

This non-endowed fund was created by a bequest for the benefit of the Presque Isle District Historical Museum.

*Michigan Karst Conservancy Fund

This endowment fund was established for the operational expenses of the Michigan Karst Conservancy.

MPAC Pledge and Operating Funds

These non-endowed funds were established to hold gifts and pledges received for the construction of the Northern Lights Arena in Alpena.

*Plaza Pool Endowment Fund

This endowed fund was designed to help meet the needs of the Plaza Pool in Alpena.

Shelter, Inc. Endowment Fund

This endowed fund was established to ensure non-interruption of operations and delivery of services of Shelter, Inc.

*Sunrise Mission Endowment Fund

This endowment fund was created to supplement the operating expense of the Sunrise Mission.

*Thunder Bay Arts Council, Inc. Fund

This endowment fund was established for general purposes of the Thunder Bay Arts Council, Inc., at the discretion of the Council's Board of Trustees.

Thunder Bay Community Health Services Fund

This non-endowed fund was created for holding pledges and donations to build a health care facility in Atlanta, Michigan. Upon completion of the building, any remaining balance will be placed into a permanent endowment fund to be used to assist with indigent patient care.

Thunder Bay Theatre Memorial and Legacy Fund

This non-endowed agency fund was established to assist with the expenses of the Thunder Bay Theatre, at the discretion of the Theatre's Board.

United Way of Northeast

Michigan Fund

This non-endowed fund was established to be used to assist the United Way of Northeast Michigan with its operating expenses at the discretion of the United Way Board.

DESIGNATED FUNDS - The

following funds were established by donors to support specific nonprofit organizations.

*Frank and Barb Agius Fund

This endowed fund was created to assist area children with the fees and costs required to play hockey in the Alpena Hockey Association Leagues.

*Alcona Community Schools

Endowment Fund

This endowment fund was created to support the Alcona Community Schools.

*All Saints Catholic School

Endowment Fund

This endowment fund is used for the benefit of All Saints Catholic School of Alpena.

*Alpena Community College Endowed Chair Fund

This endowment fund provides money which is matched by the Alpena Community College Foundation to fund a chair at ACC.

<u>*Alpena High School Band Boosters</u> Endowment Fund

This fund was originally established to benefit Maple Ridge School. However, when it closed, the original donors changed it to benefit the AHS Band.

*Alpena Public Schools

Endowment Fund

This endowment fund was created to support the Alpena Public Schools.

*Alpena Regional Medical Center Endowment Fund

This endowment fund is to be used for the general needs of the Alpena Regional Medical Center.

*Alpena Village Endowment Fund

This endowment fund was created to supplement the operating expenses of the Alpena Village Retirement Center.

*Alpena Volunteer Center Romney Fund This endowment fund was established as an ongoing source of support for the Alpena Volunteer Center with matching funds from the statewide George M. Romney Fund.

*Cliff Anscheutz Emanuel Lutheran

Church Fund

This endowment fund was established to support Emanuel Lutheran Church of Tawas City.

*Besser Foundation Administrative Endowment Fund for CFNEM

This endowment fund was established with CFNEM by the Besser Foundation to be used for CFNEM's administrative expenses.

*Besser Museum of Northeast Michigan Art Fund

This endowment fund was established to purchase original works of art, lithographs, etc. for the Museum.

<u>*Besser Museum of Northeast Michigan</u> Endowment Fund

This endowment fund was established for the general needs of the Museum.

*Boys and Girls Club Endowment Fund

This endowment fund was created for the benefit of Boys and Girls Club of Alpena.

Business and Industry Hospital Fund This non-endowed fund was

established as a vehicle through which businesses can make donations to Alpena Regional Medical Center's building projects.

<u>Carlson Family Fund for the Benefit of</u> the Huron Humane Society

This fund was created to help the Huron Humane Society of Alpena with capital costs for a new facility.

*First Congregational Church

Capital Fund

This endowment fund was created to assist with the costs of capital projects relating to the church property.

*John D. Fitzgerald, Jr. Memorial Fund

This endowment fund was created by the Alpena Rotary Club to assist Hospice of Michigan with the operation costs for the Hospice of Alpena office.

*Huron Humane Society Endowment Fund

This endowment fund will help to support the Huron Humane Society.

*Robert Kennedy Alcona Elementary School Library Fund

This endowment fund was established when the teachers at Alcona Elementary School won the Golden Apple Award. Proceeds from the fund are used to purchase books for the Alcona Elementary School library.

*Kiwanis Club of Alpena – Fletcher Fund

This endowment fund was created by the Alpena Power Company to assist the Kiwanis Club of Alpena with projects benefiting Alpena.

*Dorothy Leitch Memorial Funds

These four endowment funds were established through a bequest for the purpose of aiding in the operating expenses of the Alpena Volunteer Center in the four counties they serve, Alcona, Alpena, Montmorency, and Presque Isle.

*Lewiston Area Historical Society

Endowment Fund

This endowed fund was established to be used annually for the purpose of maintaining the Historical Society's museum in Lewiston and the area of the Camp Lunden Civilian Conservation Corps Camp.

**Lewiston Library Fund

This non-endowed fund was created to hold the pledge payments and donations to purchase, remodel, and supply a new public library in Lewiston.

*Eugene J. and Helen T. McLean Fund

This endowed fund was established with half of the income available to spend every year going to St. Ignatius Church in Rogers City and the balance going to fund projects benefiting the youth of Rogers City.

*Northern Lights Arena Endowment Fund This endowment fund will be used for the

Park Community Recreational

Complex Fund

This fund assists in the development of a community recreational complex.

*Park Museum Fund

This endowed fund was established by the James C. Park family for the benefit of the Besser Museum for Northeast Michigan for operating or capital expenditures.

*Presque Isle County Historical

Museum Endowment Fund

This endowment fund was created for the benefit of the Presque Isle County Historical Museum.

School Success Fund

This non-endowed fund was established to support the operational expenses of the family/school relations program provided by the Alpena Public Schools.

*Special Olympics Fund for Athletic Training Funds

This endowed fund was created to assist in the purchase of equipment for the training, development, and participation of athletes in official sports of the Michigan Special Olympics, and/or for training, as authorized and accepted by the standards of the Michigan Special Olympics, for developing competing athletes.

*C. Fred and Olive Steele Memorial Funds

These two funds, one established through Mr. Steele's trust and the other established through Mrs. Steele's trust, benefit many designated organizations in the Alpena area every year.

*Arthur E. Sytek Park Fund

This endowed fund was created by the Thunder Bay River Watershed Council to maintain the fishing pavilion, picnic tables and wild flowers at Arthur E. Sytek Park. The fund can also be used for environmental education.

Thunder Bay Recreation Center Fund

This fund's only asset is the actual Thunder Bay Recreation Center facility.

*Thunder Bay Trails Association Fund This endowment fund was established to help with the expenses of the Thunder Bay Trails Association.

*Toys for Kids/Feed a Family Fund This permanent endowment fund was created to directly aid the Operation Holidays Foundation in its efforts to provide food and gifts for

area families over the Thanksgiving and Christmas holidays.

*Trinity Episcopal Church Fund
This endowed fund was established to
assist Trinity Episcopal Church of
Alpena with restoration, repair and
major maintenance of the church
building.

DONOR ADVISED FUNDS - The

following Donor Advised Funds were established by donors wanting to recommend grants from the fund. These funds are a simple, flexible way for donors to organize their giving – and provide the advantage of working with our professional staff.

*Alpena Exchange Club, Ma and Cap Wixon/Lancaster Fund

This permanent endowment fund created by the Alpena Exchange Club is used to benefit the youth of the Alpena Area.

*Alpena Host Lions Club Fund

This non-endowed fund was established by the Alpena Power Company for the Alpena Noon Lions Club to help support their service projects.

Alpena Power Company Electrical Education Fund

Mini grants from this non-endowed fund are used to benefit Alpena Public and Private Schools and Hillman Community Schools for electrical education projects.

*Alpena Rotary Club Fund

This endowment fund was established by the Alpena Power Company for the Alpena Rotary Club to be used to support community service projects.

Bay View Park Association Fund

This non-endowed fund was established by the (Gus) Macker Backers of Alpena to be used for expense and upkeep of Bay View Park in Alpena.

*Child and Family Services Prevention and Critical Needs Fund

This fund provides ongoing support toward strengthening our community's most vulnerable families by attempting to break the intergenerational cycle of poverty, child abuse and neglect, and welfare dependency.

*Friends of Northeast Michigan Ecosystems Conservation Fund

This endowment fund was established for the purpose of preserving, restoring, and initiating environmental and conservation projects in northeast Michigan.

*Fund for Rogers City Arts and Education

This endowed fund was created to provide funds to bring to Rogers City arts or educational events or to assist with providing facilities for such events.

*Headwaters Land Conservancy Fund This endowment fund was established by the Headwaters Land Conservancy for their needs or charitable goals.





Community foundation tax credits are in addition to those available for donations to Michigan colleges and universities, public libraries, and public broadcasting stations, or Michigan homeless shelters and food banks.
