



The Year in Review

Grantmaking

In 2005 the Dyson Foundation approved grants totaling \$34,588,295 and paid out grants of \$14,399,624. This was the Foundation's second highest annual grants distribution ever. The Foundation made 278 different grants to 220 grantees, with 48, or 17% of these being new grantees. Our mean grant amount was \$59,919 and the median was \$20,000 (not including our management assistance mini-grants). At year-end 2005 the Foundation's active grants portfolio totaled \$89,899,928 (this includes all grants with a year of paid payment, all current year grants, and all grants with scheduled future pledge payments). Our 2005 payout rate was 5.14% (foundations are required to payout at least 5% of their assets annually in both grants and administrative expenses for charitable purposes).

Our Mid-Hudson Valley Funding Program grants increased by almost a million dollars in 2005, to an all-time high of \$6,308,520. Grantmaking in the Mid-Hudson region has increased by 145% since 2001. In 2005, 171 grants were awarded to 131 different organizations in the Mid-Hudson. Of these, 32% (\$2,198,720) were project support, 15% (\$1,099,700) were for general operating support, 6% (1,957,500) were for capital projects, and 42% (\$641,300) were for management assistance. 66% of Mid-Hudson Valley grants were directed to organizations in or programs benefiting Dutchess County, while the other counties received 5% or less of the total. Programs benefiting the region as a whole received 22% of the funding.

A sample of Mid-Hudson grants in 2005 include: a three-year grant of \$225,000 to the Eleanor Roosevelt Center at Val-Kill for the very successful Girls Leadership Workshop program; \$50,000 to the Gap Care Fund of the Miles of Hope Breast Cancer Foundation for emergency grants and to cover non-insured medical expenses of those undergoing treatment for breast cancer; multi-year year support of \$300,000 to Scenic Hudson for environmental education; a two year \$300,000 general operating support grant to Gateway for Entrepreneurial Tomorrows which supports new entrepreneurship in underserved urban areas and with underserved populations; \$50,000 to support the Sloop Clearwater's Community River Days program; a \$75,000 grant to Barrett Art Center/Barrett Clay Works to support a new downtown ceramics center which will contribute to the revitalization of Poughkeepsie's Main Street; \$141,400 to the Roosevelt Partners Marketing Project (a collaborative project of the Roosevelt organizations in Hyde Park to conduct strategic marketing); \$112,800 to AIDS Related Community Services for a school outreach program using a dramatic presentation of the AIDS Quilt; \$176,000 to Vassar College for a Community Service Internship program that provides students the opportunity to work for area nonprofits; a \$185,000 grant for a new roof to the Vassar Warner Home, a senior adult home in Poughkeepsie; and several awards to area organizations to maintain funding for Americorps volunteers when the local Americorps program unexpectedly closed its doors.

The Foundation's Management Assistance Program awarded 72 grants totaling \$641,300; 59 of these were mini grants totaling \$214,600. These grants funded strategic planning, board development, consultancies on financial management, personnel and other administrative needs, as well as staff and board training. In 2005 the Foundation awarded several executive transition grants to local organizations undergoing changes in staff leadership. Organizations receiving these grants included Planned Parenthood of the Mid-Hudson Valley, the Community Foundation of Dutchess County, the Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt Institute, and Hudson River Sloop Clearwater, and these funds were primarily used towards the costs of executive search services. In 2004, the Foundation established a

new fund to support the development of collaborations, alliances, mergers, and other formal relationships among Mid-Hudson Valley nonprofit organizations. Five grants were awarded in 2005 under this Nonprofit Strategic Restructuring Initiative.

The Foundation's national community pediatrics training initiative (the national program office of which was transferred to the American Academy of Pediatrics in 2004) completed its fifth year in 2005. A very successful and well-attended bi-annual symposium for all the sites was held in Philadelphia in February 2005. At mid-year, funding expired for the first six of ten funded sites. At year's end, the Dyson Foundation endowed the Anne E. Dyson Child Advocacy Award and the Calvin C.J. Sia Community Pediatrics and Medical Home Leadership and Advocacy Award at the American Academy of Pediatrics.

At year end, the Board also approved a number of grants that would be announced in conjunction with the Dyson Foundation's 50th Anniversary to be celebrated in 2007.

Other Program Activities

Changes were made in a number of the Foundation's grantmaking guidelines. Foremost among these was to make general operating support grants available to Mid-Hudson Valley grantees. Recognizing how critical unrestricted support is to nonprofits, the Foundation developed a set of eligibility criteria that also include a number of management, governance and financial standards that are being used in reviewing proposals for general operating support. The Foundation also announced that it would allow indirect costs (to a maximum of 12%) to be included in project grant proposals.

Three years after launching its Management Assistance Program, the Foundation retained the Innovation Network to evaluate certain parts of the program, especially including the Mini-Grants Program. Since it has began, 168 minigrants, totaling over \$1,000,000, have been awarded for management assistance projects, including consulting and training. Key conclusions of the study reinforced the value of these grants, especially for smaller nonprofits. Overall, 71% of the nonprofits surveyed (including both grantees and non-grantees) were aware of the Mini-Grants Program (47% had heard of it through the Foundation's website, and 31% from a Foundation staffperson).

Planning for a new initiative, the Funder's Network of the Mid-Hudson Valley, began in earnest in 2005. Over 250 funders make their home in the Mid-Hudson Valley, including community, independent and family foundations and corporate giving programs. Most of these do not take advantage of the professional development opportunities and networking available through existing funder associations in New York State, so the Dyson Foundation decided to support the development of an informal group for area funders. Initial workshops began in 2006.

In conjunction with the Council of Community Services of New York State, our partner management support organization, we sponsored a Nonprofit Accountability Dialogue in Poughkeepsie, NY in November 2005 as a way of promoting more discussion amongst nonprofits of standards and best practices.

Governance

The Board of Directors held four regularly scheduled meetings in 2005. As is the Board's annual tradition, one of the meetings incorporated a day of visits to grantee locations, which included a Hudson River working sail on the Sloop Clearwater, a walk part way across the Hudson on the Poughkeepsie-Highland Railroad Bridge with representatives of Walkway Over the Hudson, and a site visit to Vassar Brothers Medical Center.

In addition to its regular business, the Board approved a new Whistleblower Protection Policy, and established a Personnel and Compensation Committee.

The Board also endorsed the Final Recommendations of the Panel on the Nonprofit Sector, a comprehensive set of recommendations on nonprofit accountability and governance led by the Independent Sector.

Investments

At the end of 2005 the total market value of the Foundation's investment portfolio was \$322 million, which represented an increase of \$15 million over the market value at the end of 2004.

The Dyson Foundation's approximate return, net of management fees, was 8.9% in 2005, compared to 14.6% on the same basis in 2004. At the end of the year the Foundation's asset mix was 63% equities, 28% fixed income, and 10% private equities.

Staffing

In 2005 staff changes brought two new employees to the Foundation; Jennifer Drake joined us as Program Associate, working on grants evaluation and follow up, and Theresa Gill became our new Administrative Manager, with responsibilities for managing our office and administrative infrastructure.

Dawn Carolei, previously the Foundation's Staff Assistant was promoted to Special Projects Assistant & Mid-Hudson Valley Funders Network Project Coordinator.

During the summer of 2005, we were lucky to have an intern, Evan Downey. Evan, a Dutchess County native who hails from Millerton, was attending Davidson College, and tackled our historical files and was able to produce a detailed record of grantmaking going back to the Foundation's early years starting in 1957.

Staff spent a Community Service Day together at several houses being renovated by Habitat for Humanity of Newburgh (New York), working on painting, preparing fencing for re-use and moving construction materials.

Financial Information

Grant Appropriations and Payments

In 2005, the Dyson Foundation paid out grants totaling \$14,399,624. New approved grants, net of cancellations and amendments, were \$34,611,049. The Foundation incurred administrative and investment management costs of \$\$4,027,120.

Investment Income

2005 investment income was \$32.61 million, a decrease from 2004 which registered income of \$40.55 million.

Assets

The fair market value of the Foundation's assets at the end of 2005 was \$322.79 million*, of which \$321.89 million represents the investment portfolio. The overall increase in assets from December 31, 2004 was \$14.21 million. (*source: 2005 Dyson Foundation audit)

Funding Program for the Mid-Hudson Valley of New York State

The Dyson Foundation is strongly committed to the Mid-Hudson Valley of New York State and to improving and enhancing the quality of life in the region for all of its residents, especially those most vulnerable or economically disadvantaged. We define the Mid-Hudson region as including Columbia, Dutchess, Greene, Orange, Putnam, and Ulster counties. We have a particular emphasis on Dutchess County, our home community.

Dutchess County

The Dyson Foundation will consider grants to organizations in Dutchess County for:

- social services,

- strengthening the infrastructure of the nonprofit sector, and
- increasing philanthropy and charitable giving in the region.

Other Mid-Hudson Valley Counties

Applications from these communities will be considered if the proposed program:

- has a substantial impact on Dutchess County (e.g., serves a large number of Dutchess County residents);
- will have a regional impact on problems or issues that are significant in their scope;
- represents true regional collaborations between multiple organizations or agencies;
- provides important and needed services to economically disadvantaged children, youth, and families; or
- improves access to health care for economically disadvantaged communities.

Management Assistance Program

The Dyson Foundation believes that nonprofit organizations that are well managed and fiscally sound, have engaged boards and appropriate governance, and rely on sound planning for strategic results, are more likely to produce better programs, higher performance, and have greater impact in the communities they serve.

The Management Assistance Program (MAP) is designed to improve the organizational health of nonprofits in the Mid-Hudson Valley by providing the following capacity-building programs:

Mini - Grant Program

This program helps nonprofits in the six-county Mid-Hudson region develop new skills by providing financial support to hire consultants or to attend conferences, workshops, or seminars. Grant amounts of up to \$10,000 (covering no more than 80% of the project budget) are awarded on a competitive basis.

Cash Flow Loan Program

This program, for current or recent Mid-Hudson Valley Dyson Foundation grantees, allows organizations to continue operating without a disruption of services when funding from other sources is delayed. This program makes interest-free short-term (30-180 days) cash flow loans of up to \$50,000 per loan against fully approved government contracts and foundation or corporate grants at the cost of a small service charge.

Technology Consulting Program

This program provides technology consulting for current Mid-Hudson Valley Dyson Foundation grantees. This may include technology planning and implementation needs, as well as budgeting assistance.

As part of the MAP program, the Dyson Foundation has also partnered with the <u>Council of Community Services of New York State</u> (CCSNYS), a membership organization that provides management assistance to nonprofits. They offer a wide range of services at competitively low rates.

Nonprofit Strategic Restructuring Initiative

This new initiative, launched in Spring 2004, offers information and grant support from a \$500,000 fund to Mid-Hudson Valley organizations that are considering or engaging in some form of strategic restructuring such as an alliance, partnership, or merger. Community Pediatrics Training Initiative

The goal of this initiative, as originally defined by former Foundation president, Anne E. Dyson, is to establish pediatric residency training programs that will train pediatricians who have greater skills and interest in community-based medicine, advocacy, and who are better able to improve the health of children in their communities.

Two competitive selection rounds were conducted, the first beginning in 1999 and the second in 2001. Over 130 proposals were received, and after a rigorous review process, a total of ten pediatric departments throughout the United States were selected to receive awards. Each department is receiving a five-year grant ranging from \$1.7 to \$2.5 million. These grants will be concluded by the end of 2007.

General Funding Guidelines

The Dyson Foundation awards grants in several different program areas that each have specific guidelines. The Foundation's primary program area is the <u>Mid-Hudson Valley</u>. Other program areas include a <u>Community Pediatrics</u>
<u>Training Initiative</u>, <u>Legacy & Family Interests</u>, and a <u>Directors Discretionary Program</u>. Unsolicited proposals or inquiries are not considered in certain program areas so potential applicants should review the program descriptions carefully.

All applicants should be aware of the following general guidelines that apply to all program areas:

- As a private foundation, we can only fund organizations that are tax-exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Service Code (as long as those organizations are not classified as private foundations under Section 509(a) of the code). In addition, we cannot direct payments through a fiscal agent in lieu of an organization having 501(c)(3) designation. If you have questions about these policies, please contact us at info@dyson.org
- We do not make grants to governmental units (such as libraries and fire districts).
- We are sorry but we cannot make grants directly to individuals for any purpose.
- There are certain types of grants that we will not consider:
 - For dinners, fundraising events, tickets, or benefit advertising;
 - In response to direct mail campaigns;
 - For international projects;
 - To service clubs and similar organizations;
 - For debt or deficit reduction.

Applicants should apply to the Dyson Foundation on the basis of **these guidelines**, not on the basis of what or whom the Foundation may have funded in the past. The Foundation's interests are ever-changing, becoming more focused, or even shifting entirely to a new area in response to an emerging need.

Policy on nondiscrimination

The Dyson Foundation will not award grant support to organizations that, in their constitution, bylaws, or practices, discriminate against a person or group on the basis of age, race, national origin, ethnicity, gender, disability, sexual orientation, political affiliation, or religious belief. Grantees may target services to a particular population when the targeted groups require specialized programs to meet specific needs not shared by the general population.

How to Apply for a Grant

The Dyson Foundation tries not to impose a rigid application procedure and makes every effort to be responsive and flexible. We understand the search for funding can be frustrating and difficult, and we hope to not make the process more difficult than is necessary. The following steps should help you:

- 1) Learn about our funding: Review our various program areas and General Funding Guidelines.
- **2) Determine if you meet our eligibility criteria:** If your organization and project fit our general guidelines, you can assess your further eligibility by using our online <u>eligibility questionnaire</u>.
- **3) Submit a letter of inquiry:** A letter of inquiry is a short and concise way for you to tell us about your project so that we can determine whether to invite you to send us a full proposal. We encourage all applicants, including those who are new to the Dyson Foundation and current or past grantees applying for new projects or renewal funding, to submit our **online** <u>letter of inquiry</u>. You will receive an acknowledgement by e-mail immediately, and your inquiry will generally receive a quicker review.

If you prefer to send a letter of inquiry by postal mail or fax please download a letter of inquiry from our <u>Forms and Reports</u> section. Please do not submit a full proposal unless invited to after submitting a letter of inquiry.

If you would like to talk with a Foundation program officer before submitting your letter of inquiry, please feel free to call. However, our experience is that we can have more informed and helpful conversations **after** an initial letter of inquiry has been reviewed.

If, on the basis of a letter of inquiry, a proposed project or request appears to address key Dyson Foundation interests, you will be invited to submit additional information or a fully developed proposal. Foundation staff will generally work closely with applicants on developing an acceptable proposal and related materials.

Each project proposal will be evaluated on its own merits according to the following criteria:

- Closeness of fit with the Foundation's program priorities and values;
- Significance of the need to be addressed;
- Potential to achieve significant and enduring results;
- Capacity of the applicant to accomplish its goals and objectives; and
- Appropriateness of the budget.

During the review, representatives of the Foundation will research the proposal through telephone inquiries, site visits, and meetings with agency staff, board, volunteers, and clients as necessary. On occasion, outside experts may be asked to help review a particular proposal. Foundation staff prepare written proposal summaries and recommendations to the Board of Directors.

The time required to review a proposal varies according to the complexity of the proposal itself, the problem being addressed, and the number of proposals being reviewed. Generally, it can take at least six months from the time a letter of inquiry is received to the actual award of a grant, although the Foundation strives to be as expeditious as possible in its review of inquiries and proposals. The directors of the Dyson Foundation meet quarterly, at which time

they consider the funding recommendations of the staff. There are no pre-set deadlines for submission of materials.
