Grant Application Information

Applicant organizations must have an exemption from the Internal Revenue Service indicating that it is an organization described in Section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and is treated as other than a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the code. Public institutions may also qualify if the grant requested is to be used exclusively for public purposes.

Organizations meeting the above guidelines may submit grant proposals that address an identifiable current need, demand or problem in the community that is defined and documented by the applicant organization. Applications are accepted on a continuing basis.



Foundation staff: Tom Early, President Vicki Ford, Administrative Officer For over 10 years the San Angelo Health Foundation has served San Angelo and her Concho Valley neighbors by supporting the efforts of our grass roots non-profit organizations. Established in 1995 with \$44 million, we have committed in excess of \$24 million in charitable grants and ended fiscal year 2005 with assets of \$60,070,048. Over the life of the foundation, grants vary in size and scope from \$2,275 to East Coke County Ambulance Service for emergency equipment to \$1,750,000 for the Tom Green County Library relocation project. The San Angelo Health Foundation will continue to fund community health in its broadest form in perpetuity.





Foundation Profile




